Jacob Turner is an international disputes lawyer and author, who has represented sovereign states including Argentina, Greece, Iraq, and Russia. Jacob holds law degrees from Oxford and Harvard and previously taught law at Oxford and King's College London. Jacob is the author of a new book on the regulation of AI, due to be published later this year: *Robot Rules* (Palgrave Macmillan). *Robot Rules* explores the novel issues to which AI gives rise, from responsibility for its actions to questions of how to set and implement ethical standards. Jacob has lectured on the legal and policy implications of AI at Cambridge University and has recently started collaborating on the development of the UK's AI strategy with the All Party Parliamentary Group on AI.
